What you have been waiting for...

To become a member of the MGA the criteria is as follows. Served or are currently serving as a Marine Gunner, MOS 0306, Infantry Weapons Officer. This applies mostly to those who became Gunners after the 1988 decision. The subsequent class of 1989 confirmed the decision by our 29th Commandant of the Marine Corps, General Alfred M. Gray, to bring the bursting bomb back for Infantry Marines only. Marines who served as Marine Gunners in the infantry prior to this decision will be by exception, and of course permitted. Those Marines who wore the bomb in non-infantry MOS's are not included in this population.

For those that seek to become members, a minimum donation of \$50 dollars is required. As this is a non-profit organization without pay for the board and executives, the donations serve to cover

operating costs of the MGA such as, but not all inclusive; administration fees, materials for events, costs associated to setting up the MGA to include web domains, emails, programs, newsletters, logos and other operating costs typical to organizations like this. Becoming a member not only provides access to a unique group and network, it grants you access to our annual dinner with immediate family guests, and events as they arise. As this is a new organization, and we are figuring some things out as we go, there is no guarantee we know all things that will arise, but the goal is for this to be as accessible and painless as possible. ## Gunners and Gear

Of note, this year's Warrant Officer Basic Course (WOBC) graduated 12 Marine Gunners; 10 of which graduated in the top 10%. Gunner Beau Winn was the WOBC Honor Graduate and Gunner Alex Deykerhoff was recognized by his peers as the Gung Ho recipient. These Gunners are currently attending Infantry Weapons Officer Course under the tutelage of Gunner Keith Eggers at The Basic School, learning the tools to be successful at their first units.

This year's Gunner accession board should happen this summer, we had upwards of 40 packages submitted from the FMF, training commands, reserves and other supporting establishments for an estimated 15-19 slots this year.

Current ongoing fielding of equipment includes the M320 40mm grenade launcher replacing the M203, PC Gen III boasting a 30% weight reduction once the new plates are fielded, PVS31 Bino Night vision with white phosphor tubes, suppressors, Squad Combat Optic, high cut helmets, M18 pistols and the MAAWs (Carl Gustav).
